End of year project

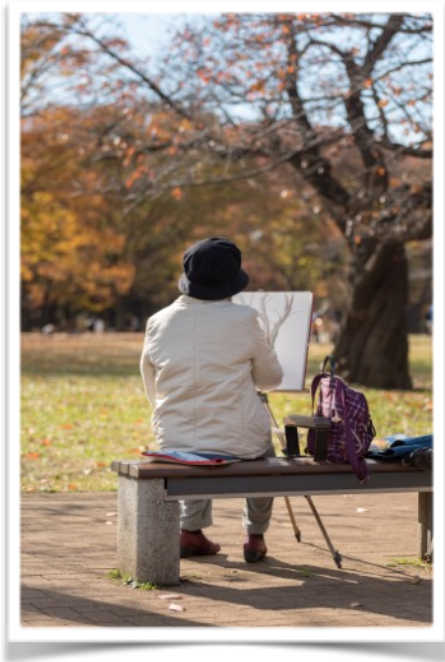
