(extcomp.thornnburycameraclub @gmail.com). Eighteen will be chosen to be entered for the competition. Images need to have IMPACT as they are only seen on the screen for 7 seconds.

NOTE that WCPF are also holding a print competition, and Simon is also requesting submissions from you for this but with a slightly later deadline, ie Monday 12th December. Similar entry terms apply.
